## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the One Hundred and Eighty-Ninth General Court (2015-2016)

An Act relative to civil service creditable time.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:* 

1 Notwithstanding any general or special law, or regulation to the contrary, creditable civil

2 service time for purposes of computing seniority for reemployment lists and reductions in force

3 shall commence with the employees permanent appointment date at to the position which he or

4 she is being separated from.
