**In the One Hundred and Eighty-Ninth General Court
(2015-2016)**

An Act relative to civil service creditable time.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Notwithstanding any general or special law, or regulation to the contrary, creditable civil
- 2 service time for purposes of computing seniority for reemployment lists and reductions in force
- 3 shall commence with the employees permanent appointment date at to the position which he or
- 4 she is being separated from.
