The Commonwealth of Alassachusetts

In the One Hundred and Ninety-Second General Court (2021-2022)

An Act prohibiting non consensual pelvic examinations.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Chapter 111 of the General Laws is hereby amended by adding after Section 70H the
- 2 following new section:-
- 3 SECTION 70I. A health care provider or a student undertaking a course of professional
- 4 instruction or a clinical training program, may not perform a pelvic examination on an
- 5 anesthetized or unconscious patient unless the patient has given specific informed consent in
- 6 writing to the pelvic examination; or the performance of a pelvic examination is within the scope
- 7 of care for the surgical procedure or diagnostic examination to be performed on the patient or, in
- 8 the case of an unconscious patient, the pelvic examination is required for diagnostic purposes.
