By Miss Gregoire of Marlborough, a petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 2275) of Danielle W. Gregoire and others relative to residency requirements for certain public safety officials in cities and towns. Public Service.

### The Commonwealth of Alassachusetts

In the One Hundred and Ninety-First General Court (2019-2020)

An Act relative to residency.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Chapter 41 Section 99A of the General Laws as appearing in the 2014 Official Edition is
- 2 hereby amended by striking the section in its entirety and replacing it with the following new
- 3 section;
- 4 Section 99A. Any member of the regular police or fire department and fire alarm division
- 5 of a city or town appointed subsequent to August first, nineteen hundred and seventy eight who
- 6 is not subject to chapter 31 shall reside within fifteen miles of the limits of said city or town. Said
- 7 distance shall be measured from the closest border limits of said city or town in which said
- 8 member is employed to the closest border limits of the city or town in which said member lives;
- 9 provided however, a city or town may increase the fifteen mile residency limit under a collective
- bargaining agreement negotiated in accordance with chapter 150E.
