**In the One Hundred and Ninety-First General Court
(2019-2020)**

An Act to include collaborative employees in group 2 classification.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 1. Section 3 of chapter 32 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2016 Official
2 Edition, is hereby amended in subsection (g) by striking out, in lines 262 and 263 the words
3 “employees of Cushing hospital;”

4 Section 2. Said section 3 of chapter 32, as so appearing, is hereby further amended by
5 striking out, in lines 275 through 280, the words “and employees of the commonwealth or of any
6 county whose regular and major duties require them to have the care, custody, instruction or
7 other supervision of parolees or persons who are mentally ill or mentally defective or defective
8 delinquents or wayward children and employees of Cushing hospital”, and inserting in place
9 thereof the following:—

10 “and employees of the commonwealth, of any county or of any educational collaborative,
11 including collaborative teachers, whose regular and major duties require them to have the care,

- 12 custody, instruction or supervision of parolees or persons who have a mental illness or an
- 13 intellectual, social or emotional disability”
