The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the One Hundred and Ninetieth General Court (2017-2018)

An Act relative to school bus stop safety.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- SECTION 1. Chapter 265 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2014 Official Edition,
- 2 is hereby amended by inserting after section 47, the following new section:
- 3 Section 47A. A sex offender who has been finally classified as a level 2 or level 3 sex
- 4 offender, and for as long as the sex offender is obligated to register, shall be prohibited from
- 5 loitering within 500 feet of a school bus stop which has been designated as such by any city,
- 6 town, or school district.
- For the purposes of this section, loitering shall mean remaining in the prohibited location
- 8 for more than 15 minutes. A sex offender who is the parent or legal guardian of a child scheduled

to depart from or arrive at a school bus stop, may remain at the prohibited location in excess of
15 minutes, but only until such time the child has departed or arrived.

A sex offender who violates this section shall be punished by a fine of \$500 for a first offense, and for a second offense by a fine of \$1,000, or by imprisonment in house of correction for not more than 3 months, or by both such fine and imprisonment, and for a third or subsequent offense by a fine of \$1,500 and not less than 3 months nor more than 2 ½ years in a house of correction. Written notification shall be made to the sex offender registry board of such violation.
