By Mr. Kocot of Northampton, a petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 2370) of Timilty and others relative to biomass facilities and solid waste combustion Joint Committee on Public Health.

## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year Two Thousand Eleven

An Act relative to biomass facilities and solid waste combustion.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. Section 159 of chapter 111 of the General Laws is hereby amended by adding at  
2 the end thereof the following: -"The department shall prohibit the transport to and combustion of  
3 construction debris or any other combustible materials treated with compounds containing  
4 arsenic, lead, cadmium, asbestos or any other substance determined to be a carcinogen by the  
5 Environmental Protection Agency, in biomass-fueled facilities that produce electricity for sale to  
6 the regional power grid.

7 SECTION 2. The department of public health shall conduct a public health impact analysis of  
8 each proposed biomass-fueled electricity generating facility in the Commonwealth, rated to  
9 consume more than one ton of combustible material per hour, including, but not limited to, an  
10 analysis of the impact of said facility on of said cancer and asthma rates within a twenty mile  
11 distance from each proposed facility. Said impact reports shall be completed and copies  
12 provided to the House and Senate clerks 120 days prior to the final action of the MEPA unit of

13 the Executive Office of Energy and Environmental Affairs on the Environmental Impact Report  
14 on the application of any proposed biomass combustion facility rated to consume more than one  
15 ton of combustible material per hour.

16 SECTION 3. The MEPA unit of the Executive Office of Environmental Affairs shall require  
17 that the proponents or applicants for state approval of operation of each proposed biomass-fueled  
18 electricity producing facility rated to consume more than one ton of combustible material per  
19 hour, complete a full Environmental Impact Report, pursuant to the laws and regulations of said  
20 agency, and satisfy the conditions determined by said agency prior to approval of any permits for  
21 operation of said facility.

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
