Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 13A of chapter 90 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2008 Official
- 2 Edition, is hereby amended by striking the second paragraph in line 25 and inserting in place
- 3 thereof the following:-
- 4 Any person who operates a motor vehicle without a safety belt, and any person 16 years of age
- 5 or over who rides as a passenger in a motor vehicle without wearing a safety belt in violation of
- 6 this section, shall be subject to a fine of 50 dollars. Any operator of a motor vehicle shall be
- 7 subject to an additional fine of 50 dollars for each person under the age of 16 and no younger
- 8 than 12 who is a passenger in said motor vehicle and not wearing a safety belt. The provisions of
- 9 this section shall be enforced by law enforcement agencies when an operator of a motor vehicle
- or passenger who rides in the motor vehicle is not wearing a safety belt in violation of motor

- 11 vehicle laws. Safety belt violations will not result in surcharges on motor vehicle insurance
- 12 premiums and a police officer may not search or inspect a motor vehicle, its contents, the driver,
- 13 or a passenger solely because of a violation of this section.
