AN ACT RELATIVE TO CREDIBLE SERVICE AT NON-PROFIT ORGANIZATIONS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Section 1: Subdivision (1) of section 4 of chapter 32 of the Massachusetts General Laws, as appearing in
- 2 the 2006 official edition, is hereby amended by adding at the end thereof the following new subsection:
- 3 (t) Notwithstanding the provisions of this chapter or any general or special law to the contrary, if a non-
- 4 profit organization receives more than 75% of its funding from the state, and is officially designated by
- 5 the state to perform services previously performed by a state agency, then any employee of said non-
- 6 profit organization shall be eligible to establish such service as creditable service for purposes of
- 7 retirement. Eligibility for the creditable service shall be conditioned upon payment, in one lump sum or in
- 8 installments upon such terms as the state retirement board may provide, into the annuity savings fund of
- 9 the state retirement system, of an amount equal to the contributions such member in service would have
- otherwise paid into the retirement system for the period of said service based upon the annual salary the
- 11 member received at the qualifying non-profit organization plus buyback interest.
- 12 Section 2: Section 1 of chapter 32 of the general laws, as appearing in the 2006 official edition, is
- hereby amended in line 251 by adding the following:
- 14 "Employee", shall mean any one whose regular compensation is paid by a non-profit organization who
- receives more than seventy-five percent of its funding from the state.
