Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

3 SECTION 1. Notwithstanding the provisions of any general or special law to the contrary, the
4 excise on alcohol as described in section 21 of chapter 138 of the General Laws is hereby
5 amended by striking out, in subsection (a) , the words “three dollars and thirty cents” and
6 inserting in place thereof the following words:- “six dollars and sixty cents”.

7 SECTION 2. Said Section 21 is hereby further amended by striking out, in subsection (b), the
8 word “three cents” and inserting in place thereof the following word:— “six cents”.

9 SECTION 3. Said Section 21 is hereby further amended by striking out, in subsection (c), the
10 words “fifty-five cents” and inserting in place thereof the following word:— “one dollar and ten
11 cents”.

12 SECTION 4. Said Section 21 is hereby further amended by striking out, in subsection (d), the
13 words “seventy cents” and inserting in place thereof the following words:— “one dollar and
14 forty cents”.

15 SECTION 5. Said Section 21 is hereby further amended by striking out, in subsection (e), the
16 words “one dollar and ten cents” and inserting in place thereof the following words:— “two
17 dollars and twenty cents”.

18 SECTION 6. Said Section 21 is hereby further amended by striking out, in subsection (f), the
19 words “four dollars and five cents” and inserting in place thereof the following words:— “eight
20 dollars and ten cents”.

21 SECTION 7. Said Section 21 is hereby further amended by striking out, in subsection (g) , the
22 words “four dollars and five cents” and inserting in place thereof the following words:— “eight
23 dollars and ten cents”.

24 SECTION 8. Chapter 10 of the General Laws, as so appearing, is hereby amended by
25 inserting after section 35BB the new following section:-

26 SECTION 35CC. There shall be established and set up on the books of the
27 commonwealth a separate fund to be known as the substance abuse health protection fund.
28 There shall be credited to said fund all amounts collected under Section 21, subsections (a) to
29 (g), of Chapter 138 from the sale of alcoholic beverages that are not considered to be sales of
30 meals, together with any penalties, forfeitures, interest, costs of suits and fines collected in
31 connection therewith, less all amounts refunded or abated in connection therewith, all as
32 determined by the commissioner of revenue according to his best information and belief; any
33 appropriation, grant, gift, or other contribution explicitly made to aid fund; and any income

34 derived from the investment of amounts credited to said fund; 50 percent of the amounts credited
35 to such fund shall be expended without further appropriation, by the department of public health
36 to provide funding, or supplement existing levels of funding, for the following purposes:-

37 (a) For a comprehensive substance abuse treatment program, to be administered by the
38 department of public health, for the treatment of individuals who are dependent on or addicted to
39 alcohol or controlled substances, and who lack public or private health insurance that would
40 provide coverage for such treatment.

41 (b) Subject to the approval of the department of public health, for comprehensive school health
42 education programs to be administered by the department of education; provided that such
43 programs shall incorporate information relating to the hazards of alcohol and controlled
44 substance use; and

45 (c) Subject to the approval of the department of public health, for substance abuse treatment
46 programs administered by the office of community corrections, the department of corrections,
47 the department of social services, the department of youth services, and the office of the
48 commissioner of probation;

49 (d) For community and workplace-based and community substance abuse prevention and
50 drinking cessation programs, for substance abuse-related public service advertising and for drug
51 and alcohol education program, to be administered by the department of public health.

52 The commissioner of public health shall annually file a report with the house and senate
53 committees on ways and means and the joint committee on public health detailing the activity of
54 the fund.

55 The remaining 50 percent of such amounts shall be expended without further appropriation by
56 the department of education for the purposes of chapter 70.
