Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

Paragraph (h) of subsection (1) of section 4 of chapter 32 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2016 Official Edition, is hereby amended by striking out the fourth paragraph and inserting in place thereof the following paragraph:-

Notwithstanding the provisions of this chapter or any other general or special law, rule or regulation to the contrary, a member in service of a retirement system as defined in section 1 who serves or has served in the National Guard or Active Reserve or who is a veteran who served in the armed forces of the United States shall be entitled to credit for such service; provided, however, that such service shall not be credited until such member has paid into the annuity savings fund of such system, in 1 sum or in installments, upon such terms and conditions as the board may prescribe, makeup payments, for each year of creditable service sought, of an

- amount equal to the 10 per cent of the regular annual compensation of the member when said
 member entered the retirement system; provided further, that such creditable service shall not be
 construed to include service for more than 4 years; and provided further, that such creditable
 service shall not be allowed for any period of service for which said member has received credit
- pursuant to paragraph (h) of subsection (1) of this section.
