## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the One Hundred and Ninetieth General Court (2017-2018)

An Act relative to a polygraph testing for police officer applicants.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1	SECTION 1. Section 19B of chapter 149 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2010
2	Official Edition, is hereby amended by striking out subsection (2) and inserting in place thereof
3	the following new subsection
4	"(2) It shall be unlawful for any employer or his agent, with respect to any of his
5	employees, or any person applying to him for employment, excluding any person applying for
6	employment as a police officer, to subject such person to, or request such person to take a lie
7	detector test within or without the commonwealth, or to discharge, not hire, demote or otherwise
8	discriminate against such person for the assertion of rights arising hereunder. This section shall
9	not apply to lie detector tests administered by law enforcement agencies as may be otherwise
0	permitted in criminal investigations."
