By Representative Livingstone of Boston, a petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 2589) of Jay D. Livingstone relative to line of duty death benefits for certain public employees. Public Service.

**In the One Hundred and Ninety-Third General Court
(2023-2024)**

An Act providing fair and equitable line of duty death benefits for public employees.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 100A of Chapter 32 is hereby amended by striking subsection (c) in its entirety
2 and replacing it with the following:

3 (c) The killed in the line of duty benefit shall be a 1-time payment of \$300,000 to the
4 family of a deceased public employee. As used in this section deceased public employee shall
5 mean any public employee working for state or county government, a Massachusetts public
6 higher education institution, a municipality, public school department, or public school district or
7 public authority who, while in the performance of his/her duties and as a result of incident,
8 accident or violence, was killed or sustained injuries which were the direct and proximate cause
9 of his/her death.

10 Section 100A of Chapter 32 is further amended in subsection (d) by replacing each
11 occurrence of the words “public safety employee” in this subsection with the words “public
12 employee”

13 Section 16 of Chapter 15A is hereby amended by inserting after the word "corrections
14 officer" the following words: - any public employee working for state or county government, a
15 Massachusetts public higher education institution, a municipality, public school department, or
16 public school district or public authority
