Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 3B of chapter 21E of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2006 Official
2 Edition, is hereby amended, in line 30, by inserting after the word “excluding”, the following
3 words:-

4 “counties, cities, towns and”

5 SECTION 2. Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary, the fees owed by
6 counties, cities, and towns prior to this act shall be waived.
