**In the One Hundred and Ninety-First General Court
(2019-2020)**

An Act relative to the online posting of CMRs.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 30 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2016 Official edition,
2 is hereby amended by inserting the following new section:-

3 Section X: Online posting of CMRs

4 Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary, each agency within the
5 Executive branch must post all relevant Code of Massachusetts Regulations (CMR) on the
6 Executive agency’s website. Each agency must further update said regulations by June 30 of
7 each year.

8 SECTION 2: This act shall become effective on July 1, 2020.
