Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- Subsection (b) of section 1 of chapter 30B of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2008 Official Edition, is hereby amended by inserting after clause (34) the following clause:
- 3 (35) municipalities operating or directly managing the public, educational, and/or
- governmental community television services for their community, as well as any contract, agreement, lease or purchase by a non profit corporation which has agreed with a municipality as
- 6 an issuing authority, as defined in section 1 of chapter 166A, to provide services associated with
- 7 public, educational, or governmental community television, provided, however, that a
- 8 municipality may opt to seek or continue to seek public bids at its discretion.
