An Act relative to the collection of DNA.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 3 of chapter 22E of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2008 Official Edition, is

2 hereby amended, by striking the first sentence and replacing it with the following:-

3 "Any person who is convicted of an offense that is punishable by imprisonment in a state prison,

4 any person adjudicated a youthful offender by reason of an offense that would be punishable by

5 imprisonment in a state prison if committed by an adult, and any person who was convicted of an

6 offense which permitted any period of incarceration in a house of correction as a penalty whether

7 or not the person was so sentenced, shall submit a DNA sample to the department within 1 year

8 of such conviction or adjudication or, if incarcerated, before release from custody, whichever

9 occurs first."
