## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the One Hundred and Ninetieth General Court (2017-2018)

An Act providing for mandatory recess time in elementary schools.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:* 

- 1 Chapter 71 of the General Laws is hereby amended by inserting after section 4A, as
- 2 appearing in the 2012 Official Edition, the following section:-

3	Section 4B. Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary, no public
4	elementary school shall decrease the amount of time it allots and provides to students as recess
5	time designed to allow students to participate in physical and social activities as a result of any
6	changes in standards or curriculum that the school is required to or chooses to adopt. For
7	purposes of this section, "elementary school" shall mean a school providing instruction to grades
8	1 through 5, and, where so designated by a school committee prior to the commencement of a
9	school year, may also include a middle school or other intermediate level school providing
10	instruction to grades 5 through 6 or any combination thereof.
