**In the One Hundred and Ninety-First General Court
(2019-2020)**

An Act relative to multi-state offshore wind procurement.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary, the Massachusetts
2 Department of Energy Resources (DOER) shall consult with the appropriate state government
3 agencies in Connecticut, Maine, New Hampshire, Rhode Island and Vermont for the purpose of
4 determining the feasibility of creating a multi-state offshore wind energy generation solicitation
5 and procurement of up to 6,000 megawatts of aggregate nameplate capacity by December 31,
6 2035. By July 31, 2019, the department shall hold at least one (1) public hearing to consider the
7 economic benefits a multi-state offshore wind energy generation solicitation and procurement of
8 up to 6,000 megawatts of aggregate nameplate capacity.
