In the Year Two Thousand Eleven

An Act relative to increasing consumer access to licensed marriage and family therapy..

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 22 of chapter 32A of the General Laws, is hereby amended by striking out
2 the last paragraph, as most recently amended by section 1 of chapter 80 of the acts of 2000, and
3 inserting in place thereof the following paragraph:—

4 For the purposes of this section, “licensed mental health professional” shall mean a licensed
5 physician who specializes in the practice of psychiatry, a licensed psychologist, a licensed
6 independent clinical social worker, a licensed mental health counselor, a licensed nurse mental
7 health clinical specialist, or a licensed marriage and family therapist within the lawful scope of
8 practice for such therapist.

9 SECTION 2. Section 47B of chapter 175 of the General Laws, is hereby amended by striking out
10 the next to last paragraph, as most recently amended by section 2 of chapter 80 of the acts of
11 2000, and inserting in place thereof the following paragraph:—

12 For the purposes of this section, “licensed mental health professional” shall mean a licensed
13 physician who specializes in the practice of psychiatry, a licensed psychologist, a licensed
14 independent clinical social worker, a licensed mental health counselor, a licensed nurse mental
15 health clinical specialist, or a licensed marriage and family therapist within the lawful scope of
16 practice for such therapist.

17 SECTION 3. Section 8A of chapter 176A of the General Laws, is hereby amended by striking
18 out the next to last paragraph, as most recently amended by section 4 of chapter 80 of the acts of
19 2000, and inserting in place thereof the following paragraph:—

25 SECTION 4. Section 4A of 176B of the General Laws, is hereby amended by striking out the
26 next to last paragraph, as most recently amended by section 6 of chapter 80 of the acts of 2000,
27 and inserting in place thereof the following paragraph:—

28 For the purposes of this section, “licensed mental health professional” shall mean a licensed
29 physician who specializes in the practice of psychiatry, a licensed psychologist, a licensed
30 independent clinical social worker, a licensed mental health counselor, a licensed nurse mental

31 health clinical specialist, or a licensed marriage and family therapist within the lawful scope of
32 practice for such therapist.

33 SECTION 5. Section 4M of 176G of the General Laws, is hereby amended by striking out the
34 next to last paragraph, as most recently amended by section 10 of chapter 80 of the acts of 2000,
35 and inserting in place thereof the following paragraph:—

36 For the purposes of this section, “licensed mental health professional” shall mean a licensed
37 physician who specializes in the practice of psychiatry, a licensed psychologist, a licensed
38 independent clinical social worker, a licensed mental health counselor, a licensed nurse mental
39 health clinical specialist, or a licensed marriage and family therapist within the lawful scope of
40 practice for such therapist.
