### The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the One Hundred and Eighty-Ninth General Court (2015-2016)

An Act to waive motor vehicle registration fees on a primary passenger vehicle for disabled veterans.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- SECTION 1. Chapter 90 of the Massachusetts General Laws, as appearing in the 2014
- 2 Official Edition, is hereby amended by inserting the following section:-
- 3 Section 2J. The registration fee for motor vehicles imposed by the Registry of Motor
- 4 Vehicles shall not apply to a motor vehicle owned and registered by a veteran, as defined in
- 5 section 7 of chapter 4, who according to the records of the United States Veterans
- 6 Administration, by reason of service in the armed forces of the United States, has determined by
- 7 the medical advisory board established under section 8C of chapter 90 to be permanently
- 8 disabled.
