**In the One Hundred and Eighty-Ninth General Court
(2015-2016)**

An Act relative to school zones.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 2 of chapter 85 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2012
2 Official Edition, is hereby amended by adding the following sentence:- No city or town shall, by
3 rule, regulation, order, ordinance or by-law, establish a school zone that extends less than 500
4 feet beyond the real property comprising the school to which the zone relates.

5 SECTION 2. Section 17 of chapter 90 of the General Laws, as so appearing, is hereby
6 amended by inserting after the second sentence the following sentence:- Any person operating a
7 motor vehicle through the parameters of a school zone established as provided in said section 2
8 of said chapter 85 at a speed which exceeds the posted limit shall be subject to a fine of 2 times
9 the amount currently in effect for the violation issued.
