An Act relative to tuition tax credit.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 SECTION 1. Chapter 62 is hereby amended in Section 6 by inserting at the end thereof after
- 2 subsection (q) the following new subsection:-
- 3 (r) A credit shall be allowed against the tax liability imposed by this chapter for in an amount up
- 4 to 20 per cent of the cost of qualified tuition and fees for higher education. The credit under this
- 5 subsection shall be allowed for the taxable year in which the expenses are incurred; provided,
- 6 that said credit shall not exceed \$5,000 in any tax year and any excess credit may be applied over
- 7 the following seven subsequent tax years.
