**In the One Hundred and Ninetieth General Court  
(2017-2018)**

An Act relative to voluntary civil commitment for alcohol and substance abuse treatment.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1           The third paragraph of section 35 of chapter 123 of the General Laws, as amended by  
2 sections 2 and 3 of chapter 8 of the acts of 2016, is hereby amended by striking out the first  
3 sentence and inserting in place thereof the following sentence:- Any police officer, physician,  
4 spouse, blood relative, guardian or court official may petition in writing any district court or any  
5 division of the juvenile court department for an order of commitment of a person whom he has  
6 reason to believe has an alcohol or substance use disorder; provided, that a person with an  
7 alcohol or substance use disorder may petition in writing any district court or any division of the  
8 juvenile court department for an order of commitment of themselves.
