Berthiaume, Jr. and others relative to the authority of parents to exempt their children from a certain standardized exam known as the Partnership for Assessment of Readiness for College and Career (PARCC) exam. Education.

In the One Hundred and Eighty-Ninth General Court

An Act relative to parental opt-out of PARCC.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary, parents or
2 guardians of students enrolled in Massachusetts public schools shall be afforded the authority to
3 exempt their children from the standardized exam known as the Partnership for Assessment of
4 Readiness for College and Career (PARCC). No child so exempted shall be penalized by reason
5 of such exemption. The department of education shall promulgate regulations for adjudicatory
6 proceedings to resolve any and all disputes arising under this act.

7 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
