#### The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the One Hundred and Eighty-Ninth General Court (2015-2016)

An Act exempting the police department in the town of Burlington from the civil service law.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- SECTION 1. The positions within the Burlington Police Department shall be exempt
- 2 from Chapter 31 of the General Laws.
- 3 SECTION 2. Section 1 shall not impair the civil service status of a person holding a civil
- 4 service position in the Town of Burlington on the effect date of this act.
- 5 SECTION 3. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
