An Act to affecting municipal rights regarding medical marijuana.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1           SECTION 1. Notwithstanding any law or special law to the contrary, cities, towns,  
2           districts, school districts or regional school districts may regulate, including prohibiting, the use  
3           of marijuana, including medical use of marijuana used for medicinal purposes. Prohibition of the  
4           use of or smoking marijuana, including medical use of marijuana on public property, shall not be  
5           deemed to be discrimination due to a medical condition under the laws of the commonwealth.

6           SECTION 2. This Act shall take effect upon its passage.
