In the One Hundred and Ninety-First General Court (2019-2020)

An Act relative to burial expenses for veterans.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1	Chapter 112 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2016 Official Edition, is hereby
2	amended by inserting after section 84C the following section:-

3 Section 84D. Every licensed funeral director, or his or her agent or servant, before an 4 agreement as to the price of the merchandise and service is made, shall make available to all 5 potential clients information regarding funeral and burial benefits for veterans as set forth in 6 section 7 and 8 of chapter 115 and shall give or cause to be given to a client, a written statement 7 verifying that the funeral director, or his or her agent or servant, make such information available 8 to the potential client. The written statement shall be signed by the funeral director, or his or her 9 agent or servant, and the potential client before an agreement as to the price of the merchandise 10 and service is made.

- 12 Any funeral director who fails to comply with this section shall be punished by a fine of
- 13 not more than \$1,000.
