In the One Hundred and Eighty-Ninth General Court (2015-2016)

An Act regarding background checks on foster parents.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- Section 51F of Chapter 119 of the General laws is hereby amended by inserting after the
- 2 third paragraph the following:
- 3 DCF Background Record Check reports of Central Registry Records on a foster parent
- 4 consisting exclusively of 51A reports determined to be "invalid", "unsupported" or by some
- 5 other designation conclude that the foster parent was not found to be responsible for abuse or
- 6 neglect of a child, shall be reported to the hiring authority as "no record". Said report shall be
- 7 considered a full accounting of the foster parent's central registry record. Nothing in this section
- 8 shall prevent the Department from maintaining and using this data in investigating future 51A
- 9 reports.
