An Act relative to dual membership in retirement systems.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Paragraph (e) of subdivision (2) of section 5 of chapter 32 of the General Laws, as most  
2 recently amended by section 67 of chapter 165 of the acts of 2014, is hereby further amended by  
3 adding the following sentence:- This paragraph shall not apply to any member who has a total of  
4 at least 15 years of credible service from membership in 2 or more systems, regardless of  
5 whether or not the member has vested in 1 or more systems. A member with such minimum  
6 total years of credible service shall receive a superannuation retirement allowance that is equal to  
7 the sum of the benefits calculated pursuant to this section as though the member were retiring  
8 solely from that system in which he or she has the highest number of days of credible service.
