The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the One Hundred and Eighty-Ninth General Court (2015-2016)

An Act establishing a tax exemption for artisan products sold in cultural districts.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

2 chapter 165 of the acts of 2014, is hereby further amended by adding the following paragraph:-

3 (yy) (1) Sales of artisan products sold in a cultural district.

4 (2) As used in this subsection, the following words shall, unless the context clearly

5 requires otherwise, have the following meanings:-

6 "Artisan product", visual arts and crafts including but not limited to paintings,

7 photographs, wood carvings, glass-based work, metal work, sculptures, pottery, jewelry, and

8 traditional or fine crafts.

9 "Cultural district", a geographical area of a city or town designated as a cultural district
10 pursuant to the provisions of section 58A of chapter 10.
