**In the One Hundred and Eighty-Ninth General Court
(2015-2016)**

An Act supporting recycling across the Commonwealth.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 4 of chapter 6C of the General Laws, as most recently amended by section 17 of
2 chapter 165 of the acts of 2014, is hereby further amended by striking out subsections (i) and (j)
3 and inserting in place thereof the following 3 subsections:-

4 (i) for expenditure for highway field services and transportation support programs
5 including, but not limited to, state police highway patrols and accident teams;

6 (j) for expenditure to provide and maintain recycling bins for the collection of recyclable
7 paper, plastic, glass and metal at each tourist information center owned, operated, or maintained
8 by the department along the state highways; and

9 (k) for any other expense of the department necessary to carry out its purposes.
