## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year Two Thousand Eleven

An Act relative to drug disposal by mail.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

- 1 Chapter 111 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2008 Official Edition, is hereby amended
- 2 by adding the following section:-
- 3 Section 225. (a) There is hereby established within the department, the unused prescription drug
- 4 disposal program. The purpose of the program is to ensure the safe, effective and proper
- 5 disposal of prescription drugs as defined in section 1 of chapter 94C.
- 6 (b) The department shall create a system for the return of unused prescription drugs. The system
- 7 shall use prepaid mailing envelopes into which the unused prescription drugs are placed and
- 8 returned to a single collection location. The prepaid mailing envelopes shall be made available to
- 9 the public at various locations, including, but not limited to, pharmacies, physicians' offices and
- 10 post offices. The agency may randomly assess the toxicity of materials received under the

11 program as long as the assessment results do not identify the patient, person who mailed the  
12 material, prescriber or pharmacy.

13 (c) The department shall ensure that only department employees handle the unused prescription  
14 drugs received pursuant to this section. The unused prescription drugs shall be disposed of by the  
15 department in a manner that is designed to be effective, secure and in compliance with local,  
16 state and federal environmental and drug disposal requirements, including the federal Resource  
17 Conservation and Recovery Act of 1976, as amended and the Secure and Responsible Drug  
18 Disposal Act of 2010.

19 (d) The department shall adopt rules and regulations to carry out the purposes of this section.
