By Mr. Pignatelli of Lenox, a petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. [BILL NUMBER]) of William "Smitty" Pignatelli and Benjamin Downing (by vote of the town) that the positions of fire chief and deputy fire chief in the town of Great Barrington be exempt from provisions of the civil service law. Public Service. [Local Approval Received.]

An act authorizing the town of Great Barrington to continue the employment of fire chief, Harry Jennings, and deputy fire chief, Edward G. McCormick .

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary, Harry Jennings, chief
2 of the fire department of the town of Great Barrington and Edward G. McCormick, deputy chief
3 of said fire department, may continue to serve in such positions until June 30, 2016, until the date
4 of their retirement or relieved of their duties by the town manager, whichever occurs first, if each
5 is mentally and physically capable of performing the duties of their respective office. The board
6 of selectmen may, at its own expense, require that Harry Jennings or Edward G. McCormick be
7 examined by an impartial physician designated by them to determine such capability. No further
8 deductions shall be made from the regular compensation of Harry Jennings under chapter 32 of
9 the General Laws for any service performed subsequent to July 9, 2013 or for Edward G.
10 McCormick subsequent to February 6, 2012, and upon their retirement, they shall receive a

11 superannuation retirement allowance equal to that to which they would have been entitled had

12 they retired on those dates.

13 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage
