**In the One Hundred and Eighty-Ninth General Court
(2015-2016)**

An Act prohibiting the obstruction of state highways.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Chapter 272 of the General Laws is hereby amended by adding the following section:-

2 Section 106. Whoever commits or attempts to commit any act to obstruct, block, detain
3 or render passage impossible, unsafe or unreasonably difficult the normal movement of traffic,
4 commerce or any emergency medical services on a limited access or express state highway in
5 any manner dangerous to the general public shall be punished by imprisonment in the state
6 prison for not more than 10 years.
