## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the One Hundred and Eighty-Ninth General Court (2015-2016)

An Act relative to establishing a limit for the municipal revenue growth factor.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Chapter 70 of the General Laws is hereby amended by inserting after section 6 the
- 2 following section:-
- 3 Section 6A. Preliminary local contribution shall be the municipality's minimum required
- 4 local contribution, increased or decreased by the municipal revenue growth factor; provided
- 5 however, that any contribution over 2.5 per cent shall require an override vote by the town at a
- 6 ballot election.
- 7 If regional school district requests an additional contribution over the permitted 2.5 per
- 8 cent, all of the municipalities affected by said increase shall be required to vote on the override at
- 9 a ballot election. A majority of the municipalities must vote yes for the override to carry. In the
- 10 event of a tie, the override shall fail.
