### AN ACT EXEMPTING CERTAIN POSITIONS IN THE TOWN OF BURLINGTON FROM THE CIVIL SERVICE LAW.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary, all positions in the  
2 town of Burlington, including positions in the school department, but excluding uniformed  
3 positions within the police and fire departments, shall be exempt from the provisions of chapter  
4 31 of the General Laws.

5 SECTION 2. Nothing in this act shall impair the civil service status of an incumbent holding a  
6 position described in section 1 on the effective date of this act. As a result, only newly hired  
7 employees shall be excluded from the provisions of said chapter 31, the civil service law.

8 SECTION 3. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
