By Mr. Golden of Lowell, a petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 3536) of Thomas A. Golden, Jr., Stephen L. DiNatale and Martin J. Walsh for legislation to protect consumers using the Internet from identity theft and online predators. Consumer Protection and Professional Licensure.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year Two Thousand Eleven

An Act relative to identity theft and online predators on the Internet.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Whereas, The deferred operation of this act would tend to defeat its purpose, which is to fight
2 online identify theft and online predators, therefore it is hereby declared to be an emergency law,
3 necessary for the immediate preservation of the public convenience.

4 SECTION 1. Chapter 25C of the General Laws is hereby amended by adding the following
5 section:-

6 Section 8. As used in this act, the following words shall, except as otherwise provided, have the
7 following meanings:-

8 "Internet service provider", a facilities based provider or other entity that provides consumers
9 with the ability to access the Internet in exchange for consideration such as through a paid
10 subscription or through an agreement to view specific ads or content in exchange for Internet

11 access."Internet service provider" shall not include an entity that provides wireless access to the
12 Internet through an unlicensed spectrum.

13 Fees paid by the Internet service providers shall be remitted to the department of revenue
14 quarterly on or before the twentieth day of the first month of the next succeeding quarter. The
15 Internet service provider shall pay 15 cents per month to the Internet Crimes Investigation Fund,
16 established by section 8 of chapter 29 be permitted to deduct and retain 3 per cent of the fees
17 collected annually for each subscriber as an administration fee.

18 The internet service provider shall not charge the consumer for said fee paid to the department of
19 revenue. Any such charge shall be an unfair and deceptive act pursuant to chapter 93A.

20 No Internet service provider shall be required to provide refunds nor produce any records to
21 substantiate any claim for refund.

22 The consumer shall produce all necessary records to support the claims.

23 Beginning on or after July 1, 2011, the state treasurer shall deposit an amount equal to the
24 monies received by the state treasury from the Internet service the Internet Crimes Investigation
25 Fund, established by section 8 of chapter 29.

26 The state police shall conduct through the

27 Internet and specially designed to protect citizens of the commonwealth accessing the Internet
28 from criminals operating through the Internet. These activities include the

29 following:

30 (a) Locating, investigating, and bringing to justice those who would commit sex crimes upon
31 children whom those persons locate through the Internet, communicate with through the Internet,
32 or both.

33 (b) Locating, investigating, and bringing to justice those persons who use the Internet to
34 facilitate the trading of images of pornography involving children.

35 (c) Locating, investigating, and bringing to justice those persons who use the Internet to
36 facilitate fraudulent schemes in an effort to defraud our citizens with Internet access of money,
37 goods, services, and other things.

38 Computer forensic examination services of computers and other electronic devices associated
39 with allegations of crimes committed against or attempted against victims of the commonwealth
40 as a direct result of their having had Internet access.

41 Proactive training of local law enforcement in the proper handling of crimes perpetrated or
42 attempted against citizens of the commonwealth as a result of these victims having had Internet
43 access.

44 The attorney general shall submit an annual report to the general court on or before 30 days prior
45 of the regular session of the general court on the status of the Internet Crimes Investigation Fund,
46 established by section 8 of chapter 29, including the amounts deposited into the fund and
47 performance data related to expenditures out of the fund.

48 SECTION 2. Chapter 29 of the General Laws is hereby amended by inserting after section
49 2BBBB the following section:-

50 Section 2CCCC. There shall be established and set upon the books of the commonwealth a
51 separate fund to be known as the Internet Crimes Investigation Fund. Amounts credited to the
52 fund shall be administered by the department of revenue which shall determine that the
53 funds are used for activities consistent with the purpose of this act. Such fund shall be a separate
54 and expendable administered by said department. There shall be credited to the fund any source
55 of monies that are equal to 15 cents per month for each consumer account billed for Internet
56 access. This fee shall be paid by the Internet access service provider for each account billed and
57 remitted to the department of revenue. Such fee shall be collected by the Internet access service
58 provided from each account billed and remitted to the department of revenue. No Internet service
59 provider shall be liable to any person on any claim arising from or in any way related to the
60 collection or remittance of the fee imposed pursuant to this section, including, but not limited to,
61 refunds of the fee to a consumer, failing to identify and collect the fee, or any use of the fee.
62 Revenues credited to the fund shall be used, subject to appropriation, for the state police to fight
63 online identify theft and online predators. The monies in the fund shall be invested by the
64 treasurer in the same manner as the monies in the General Fund, and all interest earned shall be
65 deposited and credited to the fund. All unexpended or unencumbered monies remaining in the
66 fund at the end of the fiscal year shall remain in the fund.
