*Whereas*, the deferred operation of this act would tend to defeat its purpose, which is forthwith to establish a sick leave bank for a certain employee of the Department of Health and Human Services, therefore, it is hereby declared to be an emergency law, necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

- 1 SECTION 1. Notwithstanding any general or special law or rule or regulation to the contrary, the
- 2 Department of Health and Human Services shall establish a sick leave bank for Phyllis A.
- 3 Rugnetta. Any employee of department within the Department of Health and Human Services
- 4 may voluntarily contribute 1 or more of his or her sick, personal or vacation days to the sick
- 5 leave bank for use by Phyllis A. Rugnetta. Therefore it is hereby declared to be an emergency
- 6 law, necessary for the immediate preservation of the public convenience.
