An Act relative to public safety.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1	SECTION 1. Notwithstanding section 6D of chapter 29 of the General Laws, to create
2	safer custodial inmate standards by establishing an emergency medical technician training
3	program for correctional officers in the commonwealth administered by the Norfolk Sheriff's
4	department, the sum set forth in section 2 is hereby appropriated from the General Fund to the
5	Norfolk Sheriff's department.

9	8910-XXXXFor the Norfolk Sheriff's department to establish an emergency medical
10	technician training pilot program, in partnership with the office of emergency medical services,

for correctional officers of the department and throughout the commonwealth pursuant to section
3 of this act.....\$500,000

13 SECTION 3. The Norfolk Sheriff's department, hereinafter the department, in 14 partnership with the office of emergency medical services, shall establish an emergency medical 15 technician training pilot program for correctional officers in the commonwealth, through which 16 the department shall partner with accredited EMT training institutions to coordinate training for 17 correctional officers of the department. Correctional officers throughout the commonwealth may 18 participate in the program and attend such training for EMT certification by submitting an 19 application for participation to the department.
