An Act relative to emergency EpiPens in schools.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Chapter 71 of the General Laws is hereby amended by adding the following section:-

2 Section 98. (a) Each school district shall provide and maintain a supply of emergency  
3 epinephrine auto-injectors on site at each school facility for use by trained school personnel, to  
4 provide emergency medical aid to persons suffering from an anaphylactic reaction during the  
5 school day and at school-sponsored events on school property. Each school facility shall store, in  
6 a secure but unlocked and easily accessible location on school property, a minimum of 2  
7 epinephrine auto-injectors. For purposes of this section, "school property" does not include  
8 transportation to or from school.

9 (b) The principal of each school shall collaborate with appropriate school personnel to  
10 develop an emergency action plan for the use of epinephrine auto-injectors in an emergency. The  
11 plan shall include at least the following:

- 12 (i) standards and procedures for the storage and emergency use of epinephrine auto-  
13 injectors by trained school personnel;
- 14 (ii) training of school personnel in recognizing symptoms of anaphylaxis; and
- 15 (iii) emergency follow-up procedures, including calling emergency services and  
16 contacting a student's parent and physician.
