The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year Two Thousand Thirteen

An Act relative to education funding.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

SECTION 1. Chapter 70 of the General Laws is hereby amended by inserting, after
 section 2, the following section:-

Section 2A. Notwithstanding the provisions of section 2, any other section of this chapter,
or any other general or special law to the contrary, the commonwealth shall appropriate and
expend whatever funds necessary to establish a minimum funding contribution of not less than
17.5 per cent of the gross education foundation budget for each municipal, regional or other
school district governed under this chapter.

8 SECTION 2. The commonwealth shall fund each municipal, regional or other school 9 district at the required rate of not less than 17.5 per cent of the gross education foundation 10 budget, as established pursuant to section1, on or before June 30, 2016. Any municipal, regional 11 or other school district currently funded at less than 17.5 per cent of the gross education 12 foundation budget shall be phased into compliance by funding half of any funding deficiency in 13 fiscal year 2015 and by funding the remaining deficiency in fiscal year 2016.

14 SECTION 3. Section 1 shall take effect on July 1, 2016.
