By Representative Linsky of Natick and Senator Spilka, a joint petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 3868) of David Paul Linsky, Karen Spilka and others (by vote of the town) for legislation to authorize the town of Natick to issue an additional license for the sale of wines and malt beverages not to be drunk on the premises. Consumer Protection and Professional Licensure. [Local Approval Received.]

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year Two Thousand Twelve

An Act authorizing the town of Natick to grant an additional license for the sale of wine and malt beverages not to be drunk on the premises.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

Section 1. Notwithstanding section 17 of chapter 138 of the General Laws, or any other 1 general law or special law to the contrary, the local licensing authority of the town of Natick may 2 3 grant an additional license for the sale of wine and malt beverages not to be drunk on the premises pursuant to section 15 of chapter 138 of the General Laws to Tilly & Salvy's Bacon 4 5 Street Farm, located at 100 Bacon Street, Natick, Massachusetts, upon approval of and under 6 conditions set by the local licensing authority of the said town. A license granted under this section shall be subject to all of said chapter 138 except section 17. 7 Section 2. Once issued, the local licensing authority of said town shall not approve the 8 transfer of the license issued under this act to any other location, but it may grant the license to a 9

10 new applicant at the same location if the applicant files with said local licensing authority a letter

11 from the Massachusetts Department of Revenue indicating that the license is in good standing12 with said Department and that all applicable taxes have been paid.

13 Section 3. If the license granted under this act is cancelled, revoked or no longer in use, it 14 shall be returned physically, with all of the legal rights, privileges and restrictions pertaining 15 thereto, to said local licensing authority which may then grant the license to a new applicant at 16 the same location under the same conditions as specified in this section.

17 Section 4. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
