**In the One Hundred and Ninety-Third General Court
(2023-2024)**

An Act clarifying the existing pipefitting exemption.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Section 87 of chapter 146 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2020 Official Edition,
2 is hereby amended by inserting, in line 12, after the word "employed" the following words:
3 "nor shall such provisions apply to such pipefitting performed by a person in the employ
4 of a contractor or subcontractor, retained by one of the above organizations, for any work
5 required on the organization's premises or property."
