AN INITIATIVE PETITION.

Pursuant to Article XLVIII of the Amendments to the Constitution of the Commonwealth, as amended, the undersigned qualified voters of the Commonwealth, ten in number at least, hereby petition for the enactment into law of the following measure:

HOUSE No. 3927

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

**In the One Hundred and Eighty-Ninth General Court
(2015-2016)**

An Act Relative to Expanded Gaming.

Be it enacted by the People, and by their authority, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Subsection (a) of Section 8 of Chapter 23K of the General Laws, as
2 appearing in the 2012 Official Edition is hereby amended by striking out the first sentence and
3 inserting in place thereof the following sentence:- The commission shall issue a request for
4 applications for category 1 and category 2 licenses.

5 SECTION 2. Section 20 of said Chapter 23K of the General Laws, as so appearing, is
6 hereby amended by adding the following subsection:-

7 (g) Notwithstanding any general or special law, rule, or regulation to the contrary, the
8 commission may issue 1 additional category 2 license; provided, however, that the additional
9 category 2 license shall only be issued to applicants who are qualified under the criteria set forth
10 in this chapter as determined by the commission and that the additional category 2 license meet
11 the following additional qualification:

12 (1) The proposed location of the gaming establishment shall be at least 4 acres large, and
13 shall be adjacent to, and within 1500 feet of, a race track, including the track, grounds, paddocks,

14 barns, auditorium, amphitheatre and/or bleachers, if any, where a horse racing meeting may
15 physically be held, which race track shall have hosted a horse racing meeting, provided that said
16 location is not separated from said race track by a highway or railway.

Summary of 15-34.

This proposed law would allow the state Gaming Commission to issue one additional category 2 license, which would permit operation of a gaming establishment with no table games and not more than 1,250 slot machines.

The proposed law would authorize the Commission to request applications for the additional license to be granted to a gaming establishment located on property that is (i) at least four acres in size; (ii) adjacent to and within 1,500 feet of a race track, including the track's additional facilities, such as the track, grounds, paddocks, barns, auditorium, amphitheatre, and bleachers; (iii) where a horse racing meeting may physically be held; (iv) where a horse racing meeting shall have been hosted; and (v) not separated from the race track by a highway or railway.
