*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 1D of chapter 69 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2008
- 2 Official Edition, is hereby amended by striking out, in lines 28 and 29, the words "as well as"
- 3 and inserting in place thereof the following words:- ", and shall provide for instruction in".
