AN ACT DEFINING LOBBYING.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1	SECTION 1. Section 39 of chapter 3 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2006
2	Official Edition, is hereby amended by striking out the definition of "Executive agent"
3	and inserting in place thereof the following definition:-
4	"Executive agent", a person who for compensation or reward engages in executive lobbying,
5	which includes at least one communication with a government employee. The term "executive
6	agent" shall include a person who, as part of his regular and usual business or professional
7	activities and not simply incidental thereto, engages in executive lobbying, whether or not any
8	compensation in addition to the salary for such activities is received for such services. For the
9	purposes of this definition a person shall be presumed to engage in activity covered by this
10	definition in a manner that is simply incidental to his regular and usual business or professional
11	activities if he: (i) engages in any activity or activities covered by this definition for not more
12	than 10 hours during any reporting period; and (ii) receives less than \$2,500 during any reporting
13	period, for any activity or activities covered by this definition.
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15	SECTION 2. Section 39 of chapter 3, as so appearing, is hereby further amended by
16	striking out the definition of "Legislative agent" and inserting in place thereof the
17	following definition:-
18	"Legislative agent", a person who for compensation or reward engages in legislative lobbying,
19	which includes at least one communication with a government employee. The term "legislative
20	agent" shall include a person who, as part of his regular and usual business or professional
21	activities and not simply incidental thereto, engages in legislative lobbying, whether or not any
22	compensation in addition to the salary for such activities is received for such services. For
23	purposes of this definition a person shall be presumed to engage in activity covered by this
24	definition in a manner that is simply incidental to his regular and usual business or professional
25	activities if he: (i) engages in any activity or activities covered by this definition for not more
26	than 10 hours during any reporting period; and (ii) receives less than \$2,500 during any reporting
27	period, for any activity or activities covered by this definition.
28	SECTION 3. Section 39 of chapter 3, as so appearing, is hereby further amended by inserting
29	after the definition of "Executive agent" the following definition:-

30 "Executive lobbying," any act to influence or to attempt to influence the decision of any officer 31 or employee of the executive branch or an authority, including but not limited to statewide 32 constitutional officers and employees thereof, where such decision concerns legislation or the 33 adoption, defeat or postponement of a standard, rate, rule or regulation pursuant thereto, or any act to communicate directly with a covered executive official to influence a decision concerning 34 35 policy or procurement. The term includes acts to influence or attempt to influence the decision of any officer or employee of a city or town when those acts are intended to carry out a common 36 37 purpose with executive lobbying at the state level; and includes strategizing, planning, research, 38 and other background work only if performed in connection with or for use in an actual 39 communication with a government employee for purposes of the acts described in this definition. 40 **SECTION 4.** Section 39 of chapter 3, as so appearing, is hereby further amended by 41 42 inserting after the definition of "Legislative agent" the following definition:-"Legislative lobbying," any act to promote, oppose or influence legislation, or to 43 promote, oppose or influence the governor's approval or veto thereof. Acts to influence 44 legislation shall include, without limitation, any action to influence the introduction, 45 sponsorship, consideration, action or nonaction with respect to any legislation. The term 46 includes acts to influence or attempt to influence the decision of any officer or 47 employee of a city or town when those acts are intended to carry out a common 48 purpose with legislative lobbying at the state level; and includes strategizing, planning, 49 research, and other background work only if performed in connection with or for use in 50 51 an actual communication with a government employee for purposes of the acts described 52 in this definition. 53 54 **SECTION 5.** Section 5 of chapter 268A, as so appearing, is hereby amended by inserting after the word "legislative", in line 26, the following words:- or executive. 55 56 57 **SECTION 6.** Section 5 of chapter 268A, as so appearing, is hereby further amended by inserting after the word "body", in line 28, the following words:-, as determined by the 58 59 commission pursuant to regulation. 60 **SECTION 7.** Section 1 of chapter 268B, as so appearing, is hereby amended by 61 62 inserting after clause (f) the following clause:-(f 112) "executive agent" means any person who is an executive agent as defined in 63 64 section 39 of chapter 3;. 65 **SECTION 8.** Section 1 of chapter 268B, as so appearing, is hereby further amended by 66 striking out clause (k) and inserting in place thereof the following clause:-67 68 (k) "legislative agent" means any person who is a legislative agent as defined in section
