**In the One Hundred and Eighty-Ninth General Court

An Act establishing a sick leave bank for Paul Sinkiewicz, an employee of the Department of Youth Services.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1           SECTION 1. Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary, the department  
2 of public health shall establish a sick leave bank for Paul Sinkiewicz, an employee of the  
3 department. Any employee of the department may voluntarily contribute 1 or more sick, personal  
4 or vacation days to the sick leave bank for use by Paul Sinkiewicz. Whenever Paul Sinkiewicz  
5 terminates employment with the department or requests to dissolve the sick leave bank, any  
6 remaining time in the sick leave bank shall be transferred to the extended illness leave bank. Sick  
7 leave bank days shall not be used for absences unrelated to the illness or disability that  
8 necessitated the establishment of the sick leave bank as determined by the department.

9           SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
