By Mr. Scaccia of Boston, a petition (subject to Joint Rule 12) of Angelo M. Scaccia, William F. Galvin (Secretary of the Commonwealth) and others relative to ballot questions concerning the issuance of licenses for gaming establishments. Election Laws.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year Two Thousand Eleven

An Act relative to casino referenda.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 18 of Chapter 55 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2010 Official
2 Edition, is hereby amended, in line 16, by striking the words “, or with the city or town clerk if
3 the question appears on ballots” and inserting in place thereof the following:- “or if a question
4 concerns the issuance of a license for a gaming establishment in accordance with clause thirteen
5 of section fifteen of chapter twenty-three K. Other questions which appear on ballots”

6 And, in line 17, by inserting after the words “state election” the following:- “shall be filed with
7 the city or town clerk.”

8 And, in line 81, by inserting after the word “voters” the following:- “other than a question
9 concerning the issuance of a license for a gaming establishment in accordance with clause
10 thirteen of section fifteen of chapter twenty-three K”

11 And, in line 82, by inserting after the words “state election” the following new paragraph:-

12 "Political committees favoring or opposing a question submitted to the voters of a city or
13 town concerning the issuance of a license for a gaming establishment in that city or town shall
14 file reports with the director on (1) the sixtieth day prior to the election complete as of the
15 preceding fifth day; (2) the fifth and twentieth day of each month complete as of the preceding
16 first and fifteenth day of the month, until the election; (3) the thirtieth day following said election
17 complete as of the preceding tenth day; and (4) the twentieth day of January of each year
18 complete as of the thirty-first day of December of the prior year until all declared liabilities of
19 such election have been discharged."

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21 SECTION 2. Section 22 of Chapter 55 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2010 Official
22 Edition, is hereby amended, in line 27, by inserting after the word "election" the following:-
23 "other than a question concerning the issuance of a license for a gaming establishment in
24 accordance with clause thirteen of section fifteen of chapter twenty three K"

25 And, in line 39, by inserting after the word "discharged" the following new paragraph:-

26 "Any person or corporation, association, organization, or other group of persons, other than a
27 political committee organized under section 5, favoring or opposing a question submitted to the
28 voters of a city or town concerning the issuance of a license for a gaming establishment in that
29 city or town in accordance with clause thirteen of section fifteen of chapter twenty three K, shall
30 file reports required to be filed under the provisions of this section with the director on (1) the
31 sixtieth day prior to the election complete as of the preceding fifth day; (2) the fifth and twentieth
32 day of each month complete as of the preceding first and fifteenth day of the month, until the
33 election; (3) the thirtieth day following said election complete as of the preceding tenth day; and

34 (4) the twentieth day of January of each year complete as of the thirty-first day of December of
35 the prior year until all declared liabilities of such election have been discharged.”
