The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the One Hundred and Eighty-Ninth General Court (2015-2016)

An Act relative to non-public school student access to the MCAS exam.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The department of elementary and secondary education shall issue a report

2 on the feasibility and costs associated with non-public school students and home schooled

3 students in grade 10 voluntarily taking the Massachusetts Comprehensive Assessment System

4 exam; provided that said report shall be provided to the secretary of administration and finance,

5 the commissioner of elementary and secondary education, and the clerks of the senate and house

6 of representatives who shall forward the same to the chair of the senate ways and means

7 committee, the chair of the house ways and means committee, and the house and senate chairs of

8 the joint committee on education within 6 months of the effective date of this act.
